Position Title:	Graduate Student Researcher (GSR) - Housing Policy
Duration:	Fall 2023 and Spring 2024
Expected Hours:	35% FTE (up to 14 hours/week)
Compensation Range:	Dependent on education level. This position is eligible for fee remission.

The [Othering & Belonging Institute](#) is a hub of researchers and community networks who are generating work centered on realizing a world where all people belong. The [Community Power and Policy Partnerships](#) (CP3) program partners with community-based organizations to advance strategies through which all members of marginalized communities have the resources, tools, and power to be meaningfully involved in transforming the structures that shape community wellbeing and belonging. We are seeking a Graduate Student Researcher (GSR) to work on projects focused on equitable housing policies, partnerships, and planning.

Principal Duties:

The GSR will work with the CP3 program team to develop and carry out research on various topics related to local and state housing policies, partnerships and planning that advance social equity and belonging. This research may include case studies, analysis of existing state and local policies, analysis of financing strategies, models for ownership and governance, and other areas. The GSR will be an active member of project teams, work with community partners, agencies, and advocates, and prepare and present research briefs and presentations.

Required Qualifications:

- Experience and/or education related to housing policy
- Excellent communication skills
- Demonstrated writing ability
- Good organizational skills and the ability to work independently
- A demonstrated interest in social justice

Desired Qualifications:

- Coursework in the social sciences
- Experience and familiarity with the Chicago Manual of Style
