SURVEY GOALS

- Launch the first US-wide LGBTQI+ Muslim needs assessment, made by and for LGBTQI+ Muslims
- The resulting survey data will be an open source data by Summer 2024 to help those working towards our liberation
- Develop actionable literature, including an initial findings report, to support

SURVEY DEVELOPMENT

- 162 questions spanning demographics and life domains, including immigration, relations to the police state, religiosity, healthcare experiences, sexual health and violence, and belonging
- IRB-supported through the University of Chicago
- Survey was open for 4 months, as more isolated and marginalized communities receive information later than the most-connected




DO LGBTQI+ MUSLIMS FEEL LIKE THEY BELONG?

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement?: I feel a strong sense of belonging to the Muslim community in the U.S.




Only 15% felt a strong sense of belonging to the Muslim community, while a large majority, 60%, did not.

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement?: I feel a strong sense of belonging to the LGBTQI+ or queer community/movement in the U.S.




A STORY OF BELONGING THROUGH NUMBERS

Are you a member of or regularly attend a spiritual/religious community such as a mosque or Islamic center?





Only 47% felt a strong sense of belonging in LGBTQI+ spaces, while 29% did not.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Be brave. Say the first hello, ask the hard question, be the bridge. Deepen your solidarity and inclusion with Black, Muslim, and LGBTQI+ communities.
- **Defend and improve sexual education.** Include topics of gender diverse attraction, as well as consent, sexual violence and safety, and misogyny.
- Align with abolitionist work. BIPOC LGBTQI+ Muslims are disproportionately targeted by policing.
- Include community-focused education for medical and service providers. Intersectional training can show the unique challenges of LGBTQI+ Muslims.
