"Othering," defined...



We define othering as a set of processes, structures, and dynamics that denies full humanity and belonging across any of the full range of human differences. Othering and marginality can occur on a group basis or at the individual level.








Othering is a generalized set of common processes that engender marginality and persistent inequality across any of the full range of human differences.


MGal ties that link people together with others across a cleavage that typically divides society.



Rise in Votes for Nationalis Parties




European Union, positive sentiment towards non-EU migrants, %


Climate Change is Major Driver of Global Migration


Climate Change Vulnerability


Attitudes on Immigration and Perceptions of the Economy

ATTITUDES TOWARDS MIGRATION ARE RELATED TO PEOPLE'S PERCEPTIONS OF THEIR COUNTRY'S ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

- In nearly all regions around the world, people who assess the economic situation of their country as 'excellent' or 'good' are more likely to have a positive outlook on migration than those who consider it is 'fair' or 'poor'.
- Those who consider that conditions are worsening are nearly twice as likely to favour decreased immigration than those who consider conditions are improving (48.0% vs. 25.3%).¹⁸

Responses to the question: What percentage of the country's population do you think are immigrants?


